Bias and education

This training has been developed for UMC Utrecht staff members who teach, either in a lecture hall, by supervising an intern or trainee or as a specialist trainer. In everyday life, you are exposed to all kinds of associations about groups of people from an early age. Direct and indirect messages, such as in the media, cause us to have assumptions and associations about other people related to characteristics such as ethnicity, age or gender. This is called bias. In this training you will learn to become aware of your own bias and how to limit its influence.
